Teaching Methods for Cosmetology Educators Instructor: Shaunna G. Crossen, Ph.D.

About the Program: The purpose of this 30-hour training program is to provide foundation for cosmetology educators to increase their understanding of teaching methods and interpersonal classroom processes. Participants will be encouraged to think about their own theories of teaching and student behavior and how these thoughts influence classroom instruction. This program has been approved by New Jersey's State Board of Cosmetology and Hairstyling to meet the state's 30-hour teaching methods course requirement to become a licensed cosmetology instructor in New Jersey.

Objectives: The program has been developed to give participants the opportunity to:

- Learn instructional benefits and strategies that are effective in teaching cosmetology
- Develop appropriate instructional objectives
- Acquire the ability to develop and evaluate lesson plans
- Understand the characteristics of classroom processes and their impact on students' learning
- Develop techniques to evaluate students' knowledge and progress
